## FR. RUDY'S REFLECTION:

We've all faced moments when the floor gives way beneath us, when the certainties we built our lives on suddenly vanish, when suffering or loss appears on the horizon like a storm. It might be a diagnosis, a heartbreak, the death of someone we love, or just the persistent ache of questions without answers.

In these moments, it's easy to feel lost. But today, on this Fourth Sunday of Easter—Good Shepherd Sunday—the Gospel gives us a way through. Just four verses from John 10, and yet they contain everything we need to hear: "My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me." The question is—are we listening?

We live in a noisy world. News, opinions, fears, distractions, endless input from every direction. In the midst of it all, how do you hear the voice of the Shepherd? Especially when your heart is breaking? When your prayers are messy and unformed, when your faith feels like it's flickering like a candle in the wind?

This is where the Gospel becomes not just a story, but a lifeline. The Lord is not a distant observer. He is the Good Shepherd. He knows you. He calls you by name. He walks with you in the dark valley. But to follow Him, we have to listen.

What does His voice sound like? It's the quiet peace that somehow appears in the middle of chaos. It's the unexpected strength to take one more step when you thought you could not. It's the friend who shows up just when you need them. It's the Scripture that hits your heart like a bell. It's the whisper you hear in prayer that says, "You are not alone. I am with you." Sometimes, all we can do is cry out in the dark. But the Shepherd hears. He always hears. And if we can silence the panic for a moment, if we can sit still and open our hearts even just a little, we will begin to hear Him call. Not with easy answers, but with presence. With love. With direction.

What does it mean to trust the Shepherd? It means letting go of the need to know every step of the path. It means walking even when you're scared, because you trust who you're walking with. It means allowing yourself to be led—not driven, not dragged, but gently led—by a voice that knows the way through every dark night. You may still feel afraid. That's okay. But you are not alone. Not for a single moment.
