**FR. RUDY'S REFLECTION:** It might be difficult to admit, but the devil is all around us. How else do you explain the most horrific events of our history and the hate we see filling hearts that rage

against humanity? This evil, these sins, are wideranging and seem unstoppable as they pervade our society and our individual lives. We, as children of God, recoil in horror and fear that this world is on a trajectory toward losing the battle for our souls as goodness, love, and mercy are being replaced with sinfulness, immorality, and egoism

that seem acceptable in lieu of our greatest virtues. St. John Vianney said, "Sin is the assassination of the soul."

On this Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we say goodbye to the season of Lent, the seven weeks of Easter, and the feasts of Pentecost, Holy Trinity, Ascension, and the Body and Blood of Christ. How fitting as we begin these summer months and continue our liturgical year that we consider the end of the third chapter of Mark as our Gospel today. It serves as a concrete reminder that if we walk with Jesus and follow His teachings, we will be armed with the tools He gave us "so that although our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day" (2 Cor 4:16). Jesus Christ gives us hope, a guarantee that all will be well, despite all we see and experience in this world. He is our surety— and we must have faith to live it.

Today's Gospel describes the various people who came to witness Jesus. Whatever their level of interest, concern, or malice, these people came together to evaluate and react for or against this amazing man in their midst who was turning lives upside down. In some ways, even today, people continue to assess the meaning of his life, death, and resurrection and the teachings that light the Christian faith—what Jesus means to all of us.
