## FR. RUDY'S REFLECTION:

This Sunday's Gospel invites us into the heart of discipleship: trust, humility, and perseverance. The apostles plead, "Lord, increase our faith!"—a cry that echoes in every believer's heart. Jesus responds not with grand gestures, but with a simple image: faith the size of a mustard seed can uproot trees and transform lives. It's not the quantity of faith that matters, but its authenticity and willingness to act.

This message finds a radiant echo in the life of St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus, whose feast we have celebrated on October 1st. Known as the "Little Flower," St. Thérèse embraced the hidden path of love, offering her daily sacrifices and prayers with childlike trust. Her "Little Way" teaches us that holiness is found not in doing great things, but in doing small things with great love. She reminds us that faith grows quietly, like a mustard seed, when nurtured with humility and surrender.

In that same spirit, we have started our religious education programs across the five Family of Parishes in which we are planting seeds of faith in every generation. This fall, we celebrate the collaborative efforts that are helping children, youth, and adults deepen their relationship with Christ:

- **Unified catechetical themes** across parishes, fostering shared learning and spiritual growth.
- **Joint sacramental preparation** for First Communion, Confirmation, and OCIA, building community and support.
- Youth ministry events, service projects, and retreats that inspire active discipleship.
- **Ongoing adult formation**, including Bible studies, and small faith-sharing groups.

Like St. Thérèse, our catechists and volunteers often work quietly behind the scenes—but their impact is profound. Through their dedication, the mustard seeds of faith are being sown in hearts that will one day bear fruit in our Church and world.

May we, like the apostles, ask the Lord to increase our faith. And may we, like St. Thérèse, respond with love, trust, and joyful service in the little things.
