As we commemorate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, we are reminded of Christ's eternal reign, from the beginning to the end — "the Alpha and the Omega." This solemn feast, celebrated on the Sunday before the first week of Advent, invites us to reflect on Christ's kingship over all creation. It also marks the

close of the liturgical year and prepares our hearts for the new one to come.

In our Archdiocese, today we are also celebrating *Together Sunday*, a special moment for Catholics to return to Mass and rediscover the joy of worshiping together.
